## GASPARILLA INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL & WATOTO PARTNER FOR U.S. PREMIERE, Exclusive Film & Concert Benefit in Tampa

TAMPA, Fla. (Jan. 28, 2013)—Gasparilla International Film Festival (GIFF) and Watoto, an internationally renowned non-profit that provides rescue for orphans and widows in Africa, will present a film and concert benefit on Sunday, Feb. 17 at Tampa Theatre. The evening will feature the U.S. premiere of the inspiring documentary, "Restore Gulu: Child Soldier No More" and a performance by the Watoto Children's Choir.

"We can't think of a better beginning for this year's film season than a real-life story of overcoming inconceivable circumstances to learn what the term 'community' is all about," says Joe Restaino, president of Gasparilla International Film Festival.

Set in Gulu, Uganda, "Restore Gulu: Child Solider No More" is about restoration and hope. The film tells the story of a community where 50% of the population is below the age of 15. After decades of war, the majority of the population does not know what it means to have peace in their surrounding community. The film focuses on the journey that the people of Gulu experience as they rebuild hope and happiness in their lives and country.

"Through this partnership with the Gasparilla International Film Festival, Watoto is able to bring to light compelling global issues and real life stories of rescue to audiences in Tampa Bay," says Eugene Stutzman, U.S. executive director of Watoto.

Following the film, Watoto Children's Choir will deliver one of their world-renown performances. The lively song and dance choir constructed of orphans ages 6-15 will perform their newest Broadway-style production, "Beautiful Africa: A New Generation."

The Watoto Children's Choir has performed for the Queen of England at Buckingham Palace, as well as for former President George W. Bush at the White House.

A VIP reception and meet and greet with the Watoto Children's Choir will be held at 4 p.m. Doors open at 4:30 p.m. for all attendees and the screening of "Restore Gulu: Child Soldier No More" will begin promptly at 5 p.m.

Proceeds from the evening's event will benefit the relief efforts of Watoto, as well as the local film community.
